The Marshall House, Inc. 'Witness to History' Art Event

The 'Witness to History' is a unique juried/judged art event. Artists visit and draw inspiration for new work from the grounds, buildings, history, or personalities of the Marshall House, a pre-Revolutionary War home on the Historic Register. It is the only witness to the Battles of Saratoga to have survived intact.

Works may be priced and sold by artists with a 25% commission payable to The Marshall House, Inc., to support its historical research and educational programs.

Because the Marshall House is a private home furnished with period furniture, work must be displayed on floor or table easel. Artists must furnish appropriate easels for their work.

The maximum width of work to be displayed is 40 inches for floor easels and 15 inches for table easels.
