## Garbage handling procedures outlined

A system for handling Schuylerville's garbage has been announced by village Mayor Kim Gamache. This takes effect with the October 25 closing of the town dump.

Tickets will be sold by the village for 50 cents each. One ticket must be affixed to larger bags, two tickets to smaller ones. Name and address of the discarder must appear on each ticket. Bags which the village crew declines to pick up will be labeled to indicate the reason for rejection. For those wishing to transport their trash directly to the Moreau site, stickers are available at the Saratoga town office, Mr. Gamache says. The village will continue picking up glass and newspapers, as in the past, but will now add plastic jars to be picked up the same day as glass, he adds.

In response to a request by village fire chief James Hack, the board is considering enactment of an ordinance to regulate the burning of trash in the village.

A parking problem in the downtown area also was discussed at the October 7 village board meeting. Byron Peregrin, manager of Sull's Supermarket, points out the problem for the store's private parking lot on Friday evenings. This is when the village is flooded with cars for the auction house, many of which tend to park in the store's lot on a night which is one of its busiest.

Mayor Gamache explains there is not much the village can do about the problem.

In other matters, the mayor reports he is in touch with the county alcohol control board regarding complaints of activity around the Cumberland Farms store. He also has scheduled a meeting with the chain's district supervisor and store manager. And he announces plans to possibly change both the lighting and heating systems in the village hall.

## Apples and Arts festival

The Fourth Annual Apples & Arts Festival will be held at The Bullard Orchards Farm Market and Cold Storage on Route 29, Schuylerville, Columbus day weekend, October 12, 13 and 14 from 9 until 6 each day.

Featured this year will be a museum quality exhibition of paintings, sculptures and performances, both video and live, by professional artists who live and work in northern New York or who have at one time or another been guests at the Marshall House in Schuylerville. The exhibition will take place in a vast storage chamber reminiscent of European caves where have been discovered the oldest forms of western artistic expression. The curator of the show is Sandy Straus.

Artists showing this year include 1991 National Endowment of the Arts Award Winner Nancy Brett, Stephan Eins whose major retrospectives have been mounted at the Austrian State Museum in Vienna this summer, Sandy Straus whose work forms an integral component of the contemporary art exhibition at the Museum of Nigeria opening later this fall, and Roslyn Drexler whose work was featured at the Grey Gallery, New York university this year.

Adjacent to the "gallery" video performances of music by Prix de Rome winner Bill Hellerman and past shows by the Schuylerville Community

Theatre, and others, will be continuously presented.

A special attraction this year will be the one woman performance by British stage and screen actress Trudy Porsh of Alan Bennett's play "Bed Among the Lentils," the story of an English vicar's wife with a drinking problem who is on a curious voyage of self-discovery, at once amusing and poignant. Performances are scheduled for Saturday and Sunday at 2 p.m. Miss Porsh has played important roles in Shakespeare, Shaw, and other dramas including "Seven Year Itch," "Bell, Book and Candle," and "Death of a Salesman."

## Redcoats retake battlefield

Two soldiers, wearing the Royal Scarlet, will reenter a famous battlefield on Saturday, October 12, and again on Saturday, November 2. The Battles of Saratoga were fought on the battlefield, now encompassed by Saratoga National Historical park, Stillwater.

Paul Loding and John Mead of Hudson Falls represent the 53rd Regiment of Foot, one of the British units participating in the 1777 Battles. They will make a stand on the Balcarres Redoubt from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. each day.

The Balcarres Redoubt is a fortification named after the Earl of Balcarres, a major in the 53rd Regiment. It is located at the present Stop 6 of the Park Tour road.

## School system audit results

An independent audit of the Schuylerville school system was received by the board at its September 24 meeting. While the auditor did not feel any of the violations were serious, he did report some such as the following:

Substitute teachers were used an excessive number of days; money had been borrowed from the capital project fund; there was some irregularity in the purchase of school buses; unemployment reserves were not kept in a separate bank account; and there was a slight problem with

accounts receivable, mostly in the school lunch fund.

In other matters, junior and senior high school principal Thomas Martin announced he is revising the constitution and operation of student government, and superintendent Leon Reed reminds the public that the location of school board meetings will remain uncertain in the immediate future, due to the construction.

Following the public portion of the meeting, the board went into a closed session to discuss litigation regarding personnel matters.
