Garbage handling procedures outlined

A system for handling Schuylerville's garbage has been announced by village Mayor Kim Gamache. This takes effect with the October 25 closing of the town dump. Tickets will be sold by the village for 50 cents each. One ticket must be affixed to smaller bags, two tickets to larger ones. Name and address of the discarder must appear on each ticket. Bags which the village crew declines to pick up will be labeled to indicate the reason for rejection.

will be labeled to indicate the reason for rejection. For those wishing to trans-port their trash directly to the Moreau site, stickers are available at the Saratoga town office, Mr. Gamache says. The village will continue picking up glass and newspapers, as in the past, but will now add plastic inter to be picked up the same jars to be picked up the same day as glass, he adds.

In response to a request by village fire chief James Hack, the board is considering enactment of an ordinance to regulate the burning of trash in the village.

A parking problem in the downtown area also was discussed at the October 7 village board meeting. Byron Feregrim, manager of Sulli's Supermarket, points out the problem for the store's private parking lot on Friday evenings. This is when the village is flooded with cars for the auction house, many of which tend to park in the store's lot on a night which is one of its busiest.

Mayor Gamache explains there is not much the village can do about the problem.

In other matters; the mayor reports he is in touch with the county alcohol control board regarding complaints of activity around the Cumberland Farms store. He also has scheduled a meeting with the chain's district supervisor and store manager. And he announces plans to possibly change both the lighting and heating systems in the village hall.
