Together Separates, an organization for separated and divorced women, is forming a group in Schuylerville. The first meeting will be held at 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, May 23, at 19 Broadway, Schuylerville.

The Schuylerville group will work closely with the Catholic Family and Community services of Saratoga county. Linda Geary, counselor with Catholic Family and Community services and Denise Daurio, founder of Together Separates, will chair the organizational meetings.

Together Separates was formed in December, 1977 to provide support to women experiencing the crisis of divorce and separation. The original group was formed in Mechanville. The organization has now expanded to include the

Schuylerville group. Other groups are being planned for Delmar and Schenectady.

Group experience meetings will be held semi-monthly. These meetings will consist of members sharing their experiences on different topics such as raising children, returning to work, dating, coping with loneliness, finances, dealing with lawyers and problems with ex-husbands. It provides a place for women to learn that their feelings and problems are not theirs alone but shared by many women. Together Separates also plans social activities for members with and without their children.
