AT NEW YORK MARK

ONLY 89 NEW CASES IN NEW YORK CITY AGAINST 115 YESTERDAY. COMMISSIONER EMERSON GREATLY ENCOURAGED—13 NEW CASES OUTSIDE GREAT CITY.

New York, July 24.—Infant paralysis cases today reached a new low mark in the history of the epidemic since its outbreak on June 6. Only eighty-nine new cases were reported yesterday, there were only thirteen new cases outside the city.

The number of deaths of cases at the city hospital, however, increased from twenty-three yesterday to thirty-one today.

With today's figures there have been 2,948 cases since June 6 and 609 deaths.

"In spite of the new cases today I believe our charts show the curve is now downward," said Health Commissioner Emerson today, in expressing his satisfaction with the turn of the epidemic.
