

Historical Publicity Group Opens Tours of Saratoga National Park, Schuylerville Today

The Schuylerville Historical Publicity Group has inaugurated tours of Schuylerville (Saratoga 1777) and the Saratoga National Historical Park. Official opening was today, and a trial run was staged yesterday.

The tours afford a wealth of information about the vicinity from apices to mirages, from volcanoes to yacht basins, from battles to industries. In addition, the trip, which takes about four hours, offers a very pleasant ride through beautiful country—with a cool breeze thrown in while the bus is moving.

The guides pointed out public buildings as the tour left Saratoga Springs for Schuylerville. Other communities visited were Granger, named for Judge Granger, who granted the first divorce in this area; Thomson, paper mills; Clarks Mills, paper mills; Victory Mills, box factories and cotton mills, with the site of the first cotton mill in the state.

Points of interest included the Marshall House, the Schuylerville Summer Mansion, churches, hotels, the house, sites of encampments, the Bullard orchards, the VanDerwerker Hide and Rendering Company, the municipal beach and the yacht basin at Schuylerville (another yacht basin is conducted by Paul Garney on the River Road). Sparks Knob, long extinct, the only volcano in the state; Bear Swamp, famous for mirages and practitioners of witchcraft; the old Champlain Canal, a link in the underground railroad, sites of colonial forts, the first Fort Hardy, the field of grounded arms, site of the surrender of General Burgoyne to General Gates at the Battle of Saratoga, Governor Dix's home, the DeRidder house, a link in the underground railroad, Willard's

Mountain from which Dr. Willard was said to have flashed signals of British movements; site of the Surrender Elm, sites of the trial and hanging of the English spy Lovelace and literally too many facts and dates to mention in a few paragraphs.

Tourists visited the blockhouse and General Arnold's headquarters at the Battlefield before the tour of the National Park. In the blockhouse they saw French cannon which Charles W. Snell, historian, said were sent as "lease-lend" after France came to the aid of the colonists after the victory at Saratoga.

Benedict Arnold came in for notice on the tour, both at the monument on the Battlefield and the empty niche at the Saratoga Battle Monument in Schuylerville.

One of the stops on the tour was at the Battle Monument, where a few of the more courageous sightseers climbed the 184 steps to the top.

Members of the Historical Group will take turns in conducting the tours. Guides yesterday were Miss Marilyn Thomson, Mrs. Nelson T. Drew and Mrs. George Drew.

The trip was planned by Mrs. T. E. Bullard, Mrs. Robert Laddick, Miss Mary Cuddey, Miss Thomson and Dominick Nardelli.

Transportation is provided by the Nardelli Bus Lines.

Through the courtesy of Ivan Ellsworth, superintendent of the Saratoga National Historical Park, and Charles W. Snell, historian, tourists will be guided through the Saratoga Battlefield by one of the men stationed at the Battlefield.

Yesterday Mr. Snell described the battles and indicated points of interest, and Mr. Ellsworth also accompanied the group. The Battlefield is under the supervision of

the National Park Service of the Department of the Interior.
